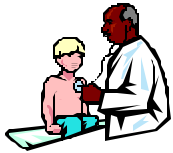

We continue our look at the phrase “if any man,” which appears 62 times in the New Testament. Some great insight is obtained and lessons learned by our examination of these passages.

“But now I have written unto you not to keep company, *if any man* that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a railer, or a drunkard, or an extortioner; with such an one no not to eat” (I Cor. 5:11). One of the grave problems in our society is the lack of discipline. It is ruinous to the home, school, government and every other area of life. It is also detrimental to the church.

In the church at Corinth there was a situation involving a man who was a member of the church who was living with his father’s wife (evidently, his step-mother). Although the problem was apparent, nothing was being done about the matter by the church. Paul speaks to their shame in regards to this issue. He scolds them for putting up with the man and glorying in the matter rather than acting quickly in disciplining him. He called upon them to act decisively and swiftly not only in this situation but in any involving those living in sin. He spoke in very similar terms to the church at Thessalonica. He stated, “Now we command you, brethren, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disorderly, and not after the tradition which he received of us” (II Thes. 3:6).

In no uncertain terms then, the church is commanded to practice discipline. It is not an optional matter. It must be done in the proper fashion, but it must be done. A failure to do so brings about the condemnation of God (as with the church at Corinth). The Lord told the church at Pergamos that He would come against them if they failed to repent of having those among them who held to the “doctrine of the Nicolaitanes” (Rev. 2:14-16). Not all members of the church held to the doctrine, but because they allowed others to hold to it without any disciplinary action on their part, they were the ones who were being censured by the Lord. God has commanded the church to practice discipline regarding those who refuse to walk in the ways of truth. We dare not refuse to do what the Lord has required.
